TOKARA is a professional group of drummers from Japan.

They play on taiko drums, which are originally from Japan.

Tokara is very unique in that they all live in Japan and are one of the most well-known taiko groups even though they are from many different countries.

They play traditional songs, but they also create many new songs which shows their special style of taiko which is very fast and strong, but also musical and fun.

Tokara performs and teaches taiko in more than 20 different countries around the world. Even though they tour around the world in many famous places, their favorite performances are school shows, and they have performed in more than 1,000 different schools around the world.

Their leader, Art Lee, is the first and only person in the world to be awarded an artist visa from the Japanese government to teach Taiko and lead the life of a professional Taiko artist in Japan. He is also the only non-Japanese person in the world to become Grand Champion in the Odaiko (Big Drum) section of the Tokyo International Taiko Contest - the world's top taiko contest.
